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# Note from Playwright, Brittany Fisher

It's truly an honor to tell the story of these powerful women, and I want to thank you for coming to witness it. From the very beginning, my promise to myself as an artist has always been to be brutally honest in my work, no matter how difficult or uncomfortable it may be. Sometimes, there has to be pain before there is growth, and we can't heal what we don't talk about. This play is a direct reflection of that promise, that reality, and how we start these important conversations.

The need to explore this topic called out to me for many years before this play was created, and when the Pipeline New Works Fellowship came along, I knew it was the perfect opportunity to bring life to these voices. Through the mentorship of the incredible David Lindsay-Abaire, I was able to give story and structure to the chaos happening inside of my head surrounding this painful moment in history. *How to Bruise Gracefully* was born: a theatrical experience intended to be eye-opening to the mistreatment of Black women in America, to shed light on how far we've come, and how far we still have to go in battling these injustices.

How to Bruise Gracefully uplifts the voices of Black women of the past, present, and future. These characters acknowledge the pain and hardship, but more importantly, they choose not to dwell in it and let it define them – that's one of many things about them that I feel that we can all be inspired by.

# Note from Director, Melissa Mowry

First, I would like to thank you for your support of Cadence, of live and local theatre, and of this world premiere production of Brittany Fisher's *How to Bruise Gracefully*. What you are witnessing tonight has been years in the making, some might argue generations. Generations of listening and learning. Of frustration and patience. Of pain and healing.

When I first read *How to Bruise Gracefully*, it was clear to me that Brittany had created a beautiful love letter to Black women. A play that recognized the exceptional circumstances of what it means to be a Black woman in America, while simultaneously showing us the power of Black sisterhood and community. I call it "the cost of Black Girl Magic", what it means to create in a world that is set up for you to fail.

What you are about to witness is a true act of love and courage on behalf of Brittany, the cast and the characters, as they reveal what it means to be strong in the face of great adversity. Tonight, as you watch this piece, I ask that you listen to these women and believe them. And as the lights fade on this performance of *How to Bruise Gracefully*, you continue to carry these women and the millions just like them with you.
